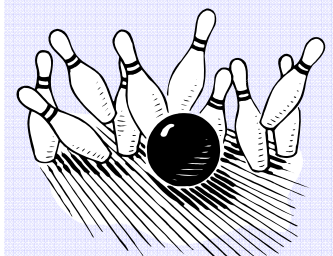

## 2,500 Benefit from Programs in 2009

Approximately 2,500 community members benefited from our free child abuse prevention education programs in 2009, and over 8,100 have participated in our programs since 2006.

Included in this total are:

- Students from Jackson, Sutter Creek and Lone Elementary schools, Lone Jr. High, and Amador High School received Online Safety & Cyber Bullying presentations.
- Early Childhood Education students at both Amador and Argonaut High Schools; and all freshman health students at Amador High School received Shaken Baby Syndrome Prevention workshops.

- Over 125 young men at Preston Youth Correctional Facility also participated in the Shaken Baby Syndrome Prevention program in 2009.
